

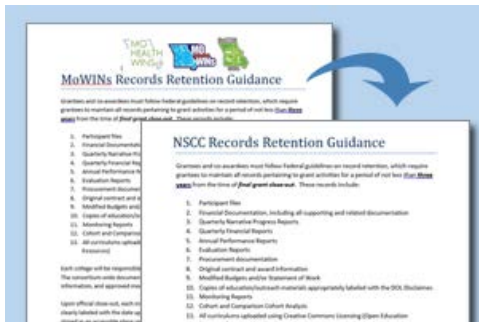
OPEN COURSEWARE FOR CTE
